Title: Unique Characteristics of Microbes from Krakatoa

Krakatoa is well-known for producing the loudest sound in modern history and a large abiotic piece of land in the Pacific Ocean more than 100 years ago, but the microbiota of this island have not been described. We examined the microbiota of the aural canals of animals collected on Krakatoa with those from 12 other Indonesian Islands. We found that microbiota from Krakatoa had genes enriched for melanin and heat shock protein.
